Contents organized by modules and available online so participants have access according to their best convenience.

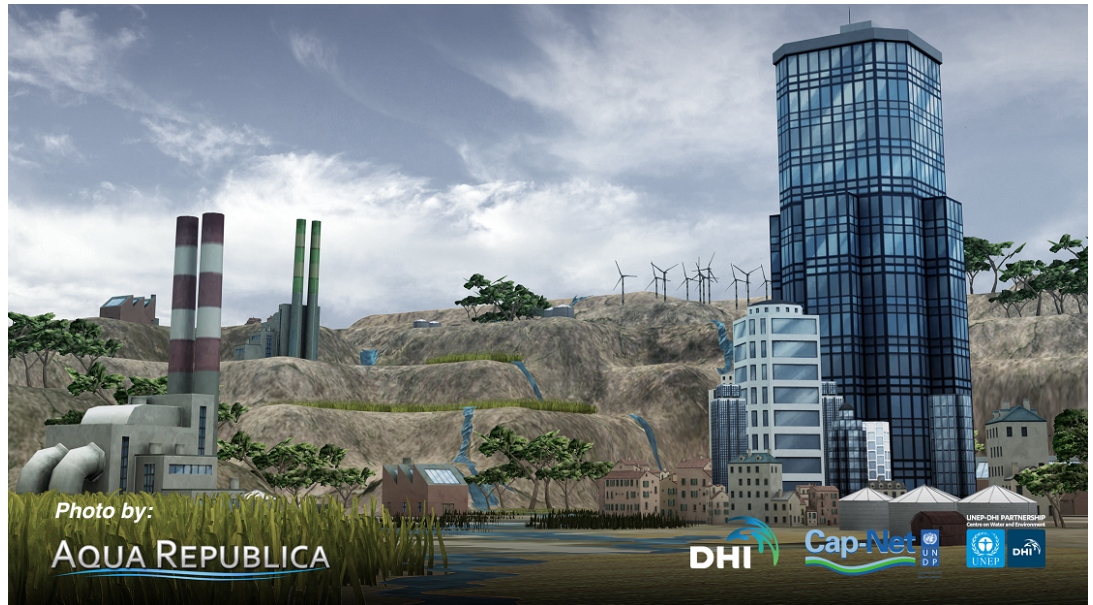
A coordinator, technical assistance, and a team of facilitators guide participants throughout the course.

Water education in schools often boils down to a rather simplistic set of activities like “turn off the tap while you brush your teeth” campaigns, aimed at raising awareness about the value and scarcity of water. Yet, the complex sustainability issues behind these concerns are often neglected, or simply unknown by school teachers in their efforts to tackle water education.

Understanding sustainability entails developing skills like systemic thinking and cooperative work, which need to be scaffolded since early childhood throughout life by means of interdisciplinary, project-based learning. However, school systems all over the world face several structural challenges to implement pedagogical practices that engage students and teachers in deeply meaningful, transformative experiences towards sustainability.

This online course offers an overview of the key sustainability concepts that may frame water education in schools more meaningfully, as well as a glimpse at a few successful models and tools from different scenarios.
